The Corporate Challenge is back and our team is ready and raring to go!

2024 was another incredible year, with our Challengers raising an astounding £232,243 for Pendleside Hospice. This generous support will make a huge difference in providing care for our patients and their families.

More than 70 companies took part, organising events such as golf tournaments, family fun days, and preloved clothing donations—just to name a few!

The Corporate Challenge is a key campaign for the Hospice, and every year, we are amazed by the businesses that step up to take part.

Pendleside Hospice expects to incur running costs of **more than £6 million** over the next 12 months. Only around 20% of this will be funded through NHS grants, meaning the Hospice must raise over £4.9 million this year through fundraising initiatives.
